The six permanent Objects of Kiwanis International were approved by Kiwanis club delegates at the 1924 Kiwanis International Convention in Denver, Colorado. Through the decades, they have remained unchanged.

- **Object 1:** To give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life.
- **Object 2:** To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships.
- **Object 3:** To promote the adoption and the application of higher social, business and professional standards.
- **Object 4:** To develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive and serviceable citizenship.
- **Object 5:** To provide, through Kiwanis clubs, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service and to build better communities.
- **Object 6:** To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism and good will.

The Eliminate Project: Kiwanis eliminating maternal and neonatal tetanus

Through The Eliminate Project, Kiwanis International and UNICEF have joined forces to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus—a deadly disease that steals the lives of 34,000 innocent babies and a significant number of women each year.

We reached our fundraising goal, raising US\$110 million in cash and pledges since 2010. However, our job is not done yet.

Now, more than ever, we are determined to finish what we started. Mothers and babies in 18 countries are depending on Kiwanis to turn promises into funding; funding into vaccines; and vaccines into lives saved and futures protected. The end of this disease means the beginning of better health for so many of these families.
