Dear Clubs in the Montana District:

Because of the challenging times with COVID-19 and cancellation of our August district convention, the district board held a special Zoom meeting on June 22 to discuss matters that would have been presented at the House of Delegates. Proposed bylaw changes for this year were withdrawn and the matter is referred to the 2020-21 board for study and review. Cathy Tutty will be elected Governor and Cherie Neudick will be elected Governor-Elect by acclamation as these are uncontested races.

Clubs will not have to vote this year. Per our bylaws Article VI, Section 16, the district delegates-at-large (Governor, Governor Elect, Past Governors and current Lt. Governors) can approve these two acclamation positions. The vote of the delegates-at-large is scheduled by email on Monday, July 27.



Kalispell Kiwanis is nearly done with the outhouse project at their lodge! The "historic" outhouse at the Kiwanis Lodge will continue.











The Key Club International Board of Trustees voted unanimously on April 16, 2020, to send a recommendation to the Kiwanis Youth Programs Board to cancel the convention. Based on health department recommendations, the Key Club board concluded that holding a convention in San Francisco, California, this year would be inadvisable and impractical because of the health threat to Key Club members, their families and all individuals traveling to and from the convention.
