

### KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION REPORT

The 104th Kiwanis International Convention was held at Disney's Coronado Springs in Orlando, Florida, on June 26-29, 2019. Presiding was International President Florencio "Poly" Lat from Manila, Philippines. Many of you might remember Poly as he was our International Trustee in 2012-13. There were 18 Delegates and 4 guests representing 11 clubs (Anaconda, Billings Golden K, Bozeman, Columbia Falls, Glasgow, Helena, Miles City, Polson, Missoula-Sentinel, Sidney and Silver Bow-Butte).

#### **Keynote Speakers included:**

- Jim Collins, author of "Good to Great" and "How the Mighty Fall" and co-author of "Great by Choice" and "Built to Last.
- Alex Sheen started the non-profit **Because I Said I Would** after his message on promises still matter went viral.
- Dillon Kalkhurst, the author of "Generation Everyone! A guide to Generational Harmony at Work, School and Home." He also put on a workshop showing how the generational principles apply to Kiwanis.
- Former Key Club member Tammy Chang, M.D. spoke about how Key Club affected her life, and how
  important it is for adults to mentor and guide youth.

Amendment 1: Add a nondiscrimination clause to the Kiwanis International by-laws. Passed.

**Amendment 2**: To allow delegates to abstain from voting for the complete number of Trustee offices to be filled. **Defeated.** 

**Amendment 3**: To require that Kiwanis International Trustees must have at least a one year absence from the board before subsequently serving in the offices of Vice President, President-elect or President. **Defeated.** 

**Amendment 4:** To establish a new seat on the Kiwanis International Board guaranteed to be held by a person who is age 50 or under at the time of election. **Withdrawn.** 

**Amendment 5:** Proposed amendment to adopt family membership status, which can be used by clubs provided their district first adopts the same status. **Defeated.** 

Proposed Resolution: Safe Kids - Adopted (as amended)

As of the end of May 2019, Kiwanis Children's Fund has raised \$106,000,000 for the project to eliminate MNT (maternal-neo-natal tetanus) from the face of the earth. We are closing in on the \$110,000,000 goal to buy tetanus vaccine for every at risk women worldwide. To date we have protected some 295,000,000 women and their projected new babies!

The latest success is that Chad has been declared by the World Health Organization as MNT free! That leaves only 13 more countries to go! Since Kiwanis took on this project, the death rate of babies to MNT has dropped 47% - that means 75 babies a day avoid this excruciating painful death! That is Serving The Children Of The World - Kiwanis style!

The Montana District has contributed \$355,171 which has protected 986,586 women and babies! That nearly matches the total population of Montana! We deserve to give ourselves a big pat on the back. A huge thanks to the members and clubs that continue to contribute!

Don't forget to spread this message far and wide. Montanans need to know what we do so they can be proud of Montana's generous spirit – and maybe want to join Kiwanis to be part of what we do.

The challenge that remains is the rest of the \$647,296 that we have pledged to this project. This \$292,125 represents 162,291 women who are anxiously waiting the vaccine for their protection and the 649,167 babies they statistically will give birth to in the next decade. That is 811,457 lives we have pledged to protect!

Can we? Of course. We have already raised more than this amount – we just have to do it again! We know how to raise funds – we just need to commit to it. We are closing in on this world changing goal – let's just get it done. By the way, don't forget our SLP clubs – they have raised \$63,858 of our total so far. What a legacy they will carry for the rest of their lives – to rid the world of this scourge!

As always, Montana Kiwanians leave me in complete awe over what we do day-in and day-out for our communities and the children of the world! Thank you for the enrichment you give my life.

#### SENTINEL KIWANIS ANNOUNCES ANNUAL LYLE HEATH VOLUNTEER SERVICE AWARDS

The Sentinel Kiwanis Club of Missoula annually recognizes two individuals: one adult and one youth (K-12) who have demonstrated an unselfish donation of time, energy, and talent to one or more non-profit organizations in the Missoula area by awarding them the Lyle Heath Volunteer Service Award. The award is named after the late Lyle R. Heath, who served on many community organizations over 26 years and was a founding member of the Sentinel Kiwanis Club.

The youth winner of the Lyle Heath Service Award is McKenna Round. McKenna is the president of the junior class at Loyola Sacred Heart School, a member of Key Club, and a weekly volunteer at Mountain Home Montana, a program that services pregnant and parenting teens. She's been working on the redesign of the community center there and works in their child care facility. At Loyola, she has organized food drives and recycling. McKenna is part of the green club which organizes Loyola recycling. She's a volunteer for the micro-Strikers soccer club, at the Ranch Club Winter Break Festival, and for Special Olympics.

The adult winner of the Lyle Heath Service Award is Julie Devlin who has volunteered at the Missoula Food Bank and Community Center for ten years. She stocks shelves, collects food for the Kid's Table, boxes groceries and prepares emergency meals. She's also a volunteer at the Senior Center facilitating bingo, working in the senior store and fundraising. She serves on the Montana Elders for a Livable Tomorrow committee working on firewise projects and climate change. Julie is a tutor at Paxon and Chief Charlo schools. And she too is a volunteer at Mountain Home. She's put her

master gardening skills to work at the PEAS farm. And somehow, Julie manages to find time to volunteer at Zero Waste Missoula and the Missoula Symphony.

Mr. Greg Cejka, the Wood Shop teacher, was instrumental: he is as interested in mentoring his students to become contributing, responsible members of their community, as he is in teaching them the skills of woodworking. The kids are proud of what they achieve, too - and were really pleased seeing themselves on the 6:00 evening news on KTVH!




